• If growing in trays let them get at least 3-5 true leaves, and bury the stems of brassicas






Pests/diseases/weeds

- Tangly problem weed






Economic Action Threshold

In home garden situations, the cost usually exceeds the benefit

In commercial situations timely monitoring is essential to target the action so it has the most effect and the least cost or damage

Too late, and the damage is already done



Simplest Lasagna Gardening Layers GardensAll.com

REPEAT: Browns & Greens to ~3 feet high

(this will cook down to ~2')

GREENS - vegetable scraps, grass clippings


BROWNS leaves, shredded paper, straw

WATER - Soak the paper layer with water

PAPER - cardboard, newspaper

GROUND - dirt, grass or weeds

Use what you have.



Compost

The fastest way to produce fertile, sweetsmelling compost is to maintain a C:N ratio somewhere around 25 to 30 parts Carbon to 1 part Nitrogen, or 25-30:1

Table 1. Typical C:N ratios of common backyard compost ingredients.

Ingredient	C:N ratio*	Ingredient	C:N ratio*
Wood, sawdust,		Fruit wastes	35:1
shavings	500:1	Rotted manures	20:1
Waste paper	400:1	Grass clippings	17:1
Straw	80:1	Kitchen scraps	15:1
Dry leaves	60:1	Vegetable culls	12:1
Cornstalks	60:1	Alfalfa hay	12:1
Shrub trimmings	50:1	Chicken manure	8:1


^{*}The C:N ratio of all materials can vary considerably depending on age and source.

Soil moisture, nutrients etc

- Organic matter
- Leaves, mulch, food scraps, worm bins, compost, lawn clippings
